

Point-in-Time Count Summaries for Homeless Sheltered and Unsheltered 2012; for Sheltered and Unsheltered 2011; and Yearly Comparisons

Data in these tables are derived from information collected in recent Connecticut Homelessness Point in Time Counts (*CT PIT*). These data account for sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons in Connecticut on a single night in January. Section A represents the results of the *CT PIT 2012* count, conducted on January 25, 2012. Per HUD guidelines, the unsheltered component of the count is conducted every other year. The unsheltered count is from the previous PIT count, in 2011. Section B represents the results of the *CT PIT 2011* Sheltered Count, conducted January 27, 2011.

- Part 1 of Section A, B, and C contains actual counts of every client in an emergency shelter or in transitional housing. It also includes the total projected count of Connecticut's unsheltered population on the date of the *CT PIT 2011* count. There is no unsheltered data for the *CT PIT 2012* count.
- Part 2 of Section A, B, and C represents segments of the entire homeless population, as informed by client responses to the PIT Count questionnaire. Answers to specific questions on the PIT Count survey tool are generalized from those who responded to those who did not, resulting in an extrapolated count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons in each appropriate category.
